

Lupa Santiago & Anders Vestergård Quartet Inside Turnabout

(Drum Voice)

Brazilian guitarist Lupa Santiago and Finnish drummer Anders Vestergård's sophomore album is a polished collection of original cuts that seamlessly melds global influences under the cohesive framework of straightahead, contemporary jazz. Recorded in Sweden while touring in support of Lisbon Sessions, the duo's 2015 debut album, the new release also features Brazilian saxophonist Rodrigo Ursaia, a friend and longtime musical collaborator of Santiago's, and veteran Swedish bassist Mattias Hjorth.

From the opening title track —
a brisk, finger-snapping jaunt that
spotlights the ensemble's superb
improvisational chops — the quartet
establishes a sound that oscillates
between vibrant tempos and
introspective forays while remaining
quintessentially modern and
unapologetically hip. Brooding and
slightly darker, "Caixa Cubo" nonetheless
emanates urban panache as Santiago
shifts from lead to rhythm, his nimble

lines supporting Ursaia's silky, melodic statements. Midway through the album, "Lärkan" features anchoring bass lines; a deep, Latin-influenced percussive groove courtesy of Vestergård's unconventional drumming; and syncopated rhythm guitar as the backdrop for Ursaia's itinerant sax. Santiago shines on his solo, adding lush, sophisticated accents to the track. The closer, "Two Step Leap," cements the album as a solid, modernjazz proposition for the 21st century as defined by the idiom's global breadth and nuanced universality.

Mostly Other People Do the Killing Paint

(Hot Cup)

Mostly Other People Do the Killing has preserved a consistent aesthetic identity against all odds. In the decade since their 2007 debut Shamokin!!!, the shape-shifting group has probed a variety of stylistic veins with a constantly fluctuating membership. In 2013, for instance, MOPDtK refracted both smooth jazz (Slippery Rock!) and traditional pre-bop (Red Hot) through an eccentric contemporary lens before crafting a note-
